



DO BROWN COWS MAKE CHOCOLATE MILK?

Focus Lesson: Do Brown Cows Make Chocolate Milk?

Materials:

Allison Investigates: Does Chocolate Milk Come From Brown Cows? by Colette Omans Nicoletta

Paper

Chocolate milk

Grade: 2

Time: 40 minutes

Objective:

Students will be able to understand that milk comes from cows, but chocolate milk is something that is created after cows are milked.

Connection:

Where does chocolate milk come from? Do brown cows make chocolate milk?

Explicit Instruction:

Put a picture of a brown cow up on the board and hold up a cup of chocolate milk. Walk around the room with the chocolate milk so that all of the students have a chance to observe it.

Give each student a sample of the chocolate milk tell them to only take 1 sip, they will get to finish it later. Ask students to make a prediction of where chocolate milk comes from.

Guided Practice:

Read Allison Investigates: Does Chocolate Milk Come From Brown Cows? By Colette Omans Nicoletta Ask the class if anyone predicted correctly.

Review that all dairy cows make regular milk and that after the cows have been milked people add in other ingredients including chocolate and sugar.

Independent Practice:

Allow the students to drink the rest of the chocolate milk as they work.







Have students create a 5 senses poem about the chocolate milk:

Chocolate milk looks like

Chocolate milk sounds like

Chocolate milk smells like

Chocolate milk tastes like

Chocolate milk feels like

Reflection – Group Share:

Allow students to share their poems with the class.
